### Teks (p. 25, 62 - 63)

## ENGLISH

### Text (p. 25, 62 - 63)

It is very important that you understand that text is more than just written notes / books / documents, etc. Text is all around us. Text refers to things we read, write, say and even the things we think! The different text types are listed on p. 25 and 62 of the study guide.

Text can also be divided into genres. This is a type of classification of a text. Movies (which are also examples of texts) can be classified as "action", "drama" and "comedy" for example.

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Because so many concepts are defined as texts, these texts often “talk” to each other or refer to each other. This concept is discussed further in Resource 8.
